Keith Holyoake presiding in Council Pursuant to the Rabbits Act 1955, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, at the request of the Minister of Agriculture made on the recommendation of the Rabbit Destruction Council, hereby declares the Peria Rabbit District, which was constituted by Order in Council on the 13th day of October 1919,* and the Turanga-o-Moana Rabbit District, which was constituted by Order in Council on the 6th day of October 1924†, to be united and to form one district having the name of the Matamata Rabbit District, the boundaries of which shall be those specified in the Schedule hereto; and further declares that the basis on which the Rabbit Board to be established for the said district shall first levy its general rate shall be the acreage of the land occupied by the ratepayer.
