192 (1) (a)	The following yarns on declaration by a manufacturer for use by him only in reinforcing the heels and toes of woollen socks and half hose: (1) Spun nylon. (Effective from 22 July 1960. Tariff Notice 68 refers.)	331-22/795/4
192 (1) (a)	Yarns of approved kinds having a current domestic value not exceeding nine shillings per pound on declaration by a manufacturer for use by him only in knitting processes: Approved: (1) Spun rayon or fibro; (2) Mixtures of spun rayon and cotton. (Effective from 22 July 1960. Tariff Notice 76 refers.)	331-22/795/4
199 (1) (a)	Hose— Convolute or corrugated, being concertina shaped throughout its whole length. (Effective from 22 July 1960. Tariff Notice 76 refers.)	331-18/84
269 (1) (a)	Flexcell joint filler sheet, being a bituminised sugar-cane-fibre sheet. (Tariff Notice 96 refers.)	331-7/47/51
352 (b)	Meatworks Appliances— Aprons, and arm guards, steel mesh, specially designed to protect workers in abattoirs and freezing works.	331-3/976
