A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to the Public Works Act 1928, I, Charles John, Viscount Cobham, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby revoke the Proclamation dated the 20th day of October 1960 and published in *Gazette*, 8 December 1960, No. 81, page 1912, setting apart Crown land and land held for better utilisation for an animal research station in Block IV, Belmont Survey District, and hereby proclaim and declare that the Crown land described in the First Schedule hereto and the land now held for better utilisation described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby set apart for an animal research station; and I also declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and after the 10th day of April 1961.
