Appointment of Committee Under Section 7 of the Transport Act 1949 to Inquire Into the Taxicab and Rental-vehicle Industries

(7) The extent of control required in the interests of public safety;
(8) The desirability of permitting one way biring of rental (3) The organisation of the taxicab industry as far as internal

(7) The extent of control required in the interests of pacific safety;
(8) The desirability of permitting one-way hiring of rental vehicles and any special conditions which should be associated with one-way hiring;
(9) Any other matters relating to the provision of efficient and adequate taxicab and rental-vehicle services to the public at a reasonable cost.

The report required herein is to be submitted to the Minister of Transport not later than the 30th day of September 1961, or such later date as the Minister may approve.
