The Land and Income Tax Payment Order 1961

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 7th day of June 1961

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Land and Income Tax Act 1954, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. This order may be cited as the Land and Income Tax Payment Order 1961.

2. Expressions used in this order have the same meanings as in the Land and Income Tax Act 1954.

3. This order applies to—

(a) Land tax for the year of assessment which commenced on the 1st day of April 1961; and

(b) Income tax payable for that year of assessment on income derived (or deemed to have been derived) during the income year which commenced on the 1st day of April 1960 by—

(i) Every subsisting company otherwise than as trustee or agent:

(ii) Every public authority otherwise than as trustee or agent:

(iii) Every Maori authority.

4. Land tax shall be due and payable in one sum on the 7th day of October 1961.

5. Income tax to which this order applies shall be due and payable in one sum on the 7th day of February 1962.

6. Land tax and income tax to which this order applies shall be payable at any office of the Taxes Division, Inland Revenue Department, or at any money-order post office.
