Plants Declared Noxious Weeds in Borough of Mosgiel (Notice No. Ag. 7303)

PURSUANT to section 3 of the Noxious Weeds Act 1950, the Director-General of Agriculture, acting under a delegation from the Minister of Agriculture for the purposes of the said section, hereby publishes the following special order made by the Mosgiel Borough Council on the 12th day of June 1961.

SPECIAL ORDER

RESOLVED that, pursuant to the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Act 1954 and of the Noxious Weeds Act 1950 and all other powers in that behalf enabling it, the Mosgiel Borough Council hereby resolves, by way of special order, that the plants set out in the Schedule hereto be, and the same are hereby declared to be, noxious weeds within the Borough of Mosgiel on and after the 1st day of July 1961, in addition to those plants listed in the Schedule to the special order made by the said Council on the 18th day of June 1951.

SPECIAL ORDER

Saffron thistle (*Carthamus lanatus*).
Sweetbiar (*Rosa eglanteria* syn. *Rosa rubiginosa*).
Spiderwort (*Leycesteria formosa*).
Tutsan (*Hypericum androsaemum*).
