ALL that area in the Wellington Land District, County of Rangitikei, containing 97,700 acres, more or less, bounded by a line commencing at a point in the middle of the Rangitikei River on the middle line of the Greatford-Ashhurst road (Kakariki Road); thence north-westerly generally along the middle of that road, the Horopito-Bulls road (Cliff Road), the Crofton Road, the Makirikiri Road, the Neumann's Road, the Turakina-Cliff road (Bonny Glen Road), and the Hamilton-Woodville via New Plymouth State Highway No. 3 to the middle of the Turakina River; thence south-westerly generally down the middle of that river to its mouth; thence southdown the middle of that river to its mouth; thence south-easterly generally along the sea coast to the middle of the mouth of the Rangitikei River; thence north-easterly generally up the middle of that river to the point of commencement.
