BOUNDARIES OF THE WESTERN SOUTHLAND RABBIT DISTRICT ALL that area in the Southland Land District containing by estimation 967,000 acres, more or less, inclusive of roads, railways, and streams and bounded as follows: Commencing at the junction of the sea coast and the left bank of Big River, being a point on the boundary of the Fiordland National Park as described in the Fifth Schedule to the National Parks Act 1952 and amended by *Gazette*, 1956, p. 1607; thence proceeding north-easterly generally along the Fiordland National Park boundary to the northern boundary of Block VIII, Monowai Survey District; thence westerly generally along the northern boundary of the said Block VIII to the eastern shore of Lake Monowai; thence north-westerly generally along the said eastern shore, across the mouth of the Monowai River and along the northern shore of Lake Monowai to a point in line with the north-western side of Lake Road; thence north-easterly to and along the said north-western side and along the western boundary of Run 463 to Trig.
