CC in Block II aforesaid; thence north-easterly along a right line across Kenepuru Sound to Koutuwai Point, and along the watershed between the Pelorus and Kenepuru Sounds to its intersection with the northern boundary of Section 9, Block II aforesaid; thence easterly along the northern boundary of the said Section 9 to the north-eastern corner of the said section; thence generally north-easterly along the south-eastern boundary of Section 15, Block III, Oriero Survey District, to the northernmost corner of Section 14, Block III aforesaid, and along a right line to the north-western corner of Section 11, Block II, Oriero Survey District; thence easterly along the northern boundary of the said Section 11 to its north-east corner; thence northerly and north-westerly along the eastern and north-eastern boundaries of Section 16, Block II aforesaid, to the westernmost corner of Section 180, Block II aforesaid; thence north-easterly along the north-western boundary of the said Section 180, and its production to the western shore of Wet Inlet; thence generally north-easterly along the shores of Wet Inlet, Elie Bay, Crail Bay, Clova Bay, and Beatrix Bay to a point in line with the south-western boundary of Section 1, Block IX, Oriero Survey District; thence south-easterly to and along that boundary to the south-western corner of the said Section 1; thence easterly along the northern boundary of Section 2, Block IX aforesaid, to the north-eastern corner of the said Section 2; thence generally south-easterly along the north-eastern boundary of Crown land, Block III, Gore Survey District, the north-eastern boundaries of Sections 13 and 12, Block II, Gore Survey District, and the north-eastern and eastern boundaries of Section 14, Block II aforesaid, to the south-eastern corner of the last-mentioned section; thence westerly along the southern boundary of the said Section 14 to the north-eastern corner of that portion of State forest containing 520 acres; thence south-westerly along the south-eastern boundary of the said State forest to the north-eastern corner of Section 15, Block II aforesaid; thence generally south-easterly along the north-eastern boundaries of the said Section 15 and that portion of State forest containing 160 acres to the boundary between Blocks I and II, Gore Survey District; thence due east to the north-western boundary of Section 24, Block VI, Gore Survey District; thence north-easterly along the said boundary of Section 24 to the northernmost corner of the said Section 24; thence north-westerly, north-easterly, and northerly along the south-western and north-western boundaries of Lot 2, D.P. 866, and the western boundary of Lot 1, D.P. 866, to the north-western corner of the last-mentioned lot in Block VII, Gore Survey District; thence easterly along a right line to the point of commencement.

#### *Motor Trade Show Order 1961*

COBHAM, Governor-General  
ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 19th day of December 1961

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. KEITH HOLYOAKE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Exhibitions Act 1910, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

#### ORDER

1. This order may be cited as the Motor Trade Show Order 1961.

2. In this order, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“The Act” means the Exhibitions Act 1910;

“The promoter” means the Auckland Manufacturers’ Association and the Auckland Agricultural and Pastoral Association;

“The exhibition” means a public exhibition of cars and motor vehicles to be conducted by the promoter at the Epsom Showgrounds, Auckland, from the 22nd day of December 1961 to the 5th day of January 1962 (both inclusive), and to known as the 1961–62 Motor Trade Show.

3. The exhibition is hereby authorised, and declared to be an exhibition within the meaning of the Act.

4. Subject to the conditions set out in the Schedule hereto, the following provisions are hereby suspended in so far as they relate to work done or business conducted or services rendered in the said premises during the period of the exhibition, by or on behalf of the promoter, or by or on behalf of any exhibitor at the exhibition, or by any person employed in or about the exhibition, namely—such of the provisions of—

(a) The Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1954 and all awards and industrial agreements in force thereunder;

(b) The Shops and Offices Act 1955; and

(c) The Factories Act 1946,—

as relate to the hours of commencing or ceasing work, or to the issue of permits, or to the payment for overtime, or extended hours, or to holidays, and half-holidays, or to the closing of shops.

#### SCHEDULE

1. Forty hours shall constitute a week’s work to be worked on five days of the week and eight hours shall constitute a day’s work in or about the exhibition, and, with the exception set out in clause 2 hereof, the daily hours shall be worked consecutively.

2. No person shall be employed in or about the exhibition for more than four hours without an interval of at least three-quarters of an hour for a meal.

3. (a) Any person employed during any day in or about the exhibition who is employed on that day for more than eight hours, or before the hour of 8 a.m., or after the hour of 10.30 p.m. or on any day in excess of five days per week (whether the excess employment is in or about the exhibition or otherwise) shall be paid for the excess employment at not less than half as much again as the ordinary rate for the first two hours and at not less than twice the ordinary rate thereafter.

(b) Any person employed in or about the exhibition on any day that would, but for the provisions of this order, have been a whole holiday for that person by virtue of any Act or of any award or industrial agreement shall be paid for all work done on that day at not less than twice the ordinary rate whether the work is performed wholly in or about the exhibition or otherwise: Provided that nothing in this subclause shall be deemed to deprive any person of any other payment for the said holiday to which he is entitled under any Act or award or industrial agreement.

4. No male under 18 years of age and no female shall be employed in or about the exhibition after the hour of 10.30 p.m.

5. For the purposes of the enforcement of an award or industrial agreement any provision of which has been suspended by this order, any officer of the industrial union or association concerned who is authorised in writing in that behalf by the union or association shall be entitled to interview at his place of employment any person employed in or about the exhibition under that award or industrial agreement at such time or times as may be agreed upon between the officer and the employer of that person, and for this purpose any such officer shall be entitled at any time to have access to the Register of Passes issued by the promoter.

6. Nothing in this order shall be deemed to affect any provisions in an award or industrial agreement requiring workers subject to the award or industrial agreement to be members of a union.
