Declaring Areas to be Access Lanes for the Purposes of the Motor Launch Regulations 1958

PURSUANT to the Motor Launch Regulations 1958, the Minister of Marine hereby declares that for a period of two years from the date hereof, subject to compliance with the conditions set out in the Second Schedule hereto, the areas of water firstly and secondly described in the First Schedule hereto shall be access lanes, and that within such access lanes regulations 9 and 10 of the Motor Launch Regulations 1958 shall not apply 1958 shall not apply.
