generally along the summit of that range to Mount Faraday; thence north-easterly generally along the watershed between the Buller and Inangahua Rivers and a right line to the confluence of the said rivers; thence south-easterly along a right line to the summit of the Brunner Range at a corner in the boundary of a State forest in Block IX, Maruia Survey District; thence north-easterly generally along the summit of the last-mentioned range to a point due south of the confluence of Eight Mile or Boundary Creek and the Buller River; thence due north along a right line to the last-mentioned confluence; thence northerly generally to and along the summit of a leading spur on the western side of Boundary Creek to Bald Hill; thence north-easterly and northerly generally along the summit of the Lyell Range, easterly generally along the summit of the Marino Mountains, passing through Trig. Stations W and D, and southerly along a spur to Mount Owen; thence south-easterly along a right line to the confluence of the Hope and Buller Rivers; thence easterly generally to and along the watershed between the last-mentioned two rivers and south-easterly generally along the watershed between the Buller and Motupiko Rivers to the summit of the St. Arnaud Range; thence south-westerly generally along the summit of the St. Arnaud Range, the Spenser Mountains, and the Southern Alps to Mount Aspiring; thence westerly along a right line to the middle of the mouth of the Awarua River in Big Bay; thence north-easterly generally along the sea coast, crossing the mouths of all harbours and inlets, to the point of commencement.

NELSON

All that area bounded by a line commencing at a point on the northwest sea coast of the Boulder Bank in line with the north-eastern boundary of Section 16, Block IX, Wakapuaka Survey District, and proceeding southeasterly to and along the said boundary to the easternmost corner of the said section; thence south-easterly along a leading ridge to Wells Hill Trig. Station; thence south-westerly along the main ridge and north-westerly along a prominent spur to the easternmost corner of part Section 8, Block IX, Wakapuaka Survey District; thence along a right line to the easternmost corner of Section 36, District of Brook Street and Maitai; thence south-westerly senerally along the south-eastern boundary of the said Section 36, the south-eastern boundary of Rural Section 1, District of Brook Street and Maitai, and the production of the last-mentioned boundary to its intersection with the north-western boundary of Section 22, Square 16; thence south-westerly and south-eastern boundary of Section 8, Block IV, Manugatapu Survey District; thence westerly and south-easterly senerally along the northern boundary of Section 8, Block IV, Manugatapu Survey District; thence westerly and south-erly along the northern and western boundaries of the said Section 8 and the production of the last-mentioned boundary to the middle of the Roding River; thence westerly generally down the middle of the said river to a point in line with the middle of a road through Section 5, Block VIII, Waimea Survey District; thence to and along the middle of the said road to a point in line with the morth-eastern boundary of Section 60, Square 1; thence westerly along a right line to the northernmost corner of Section 18, Block VII, Waimea Survey District; thence south-westerly along the south-eastern boundary of Ecotion 60, Square 1; thence westerly along a right line to the casting state of the said road to a point in line with the north-eastern boundaries of Lot 3, DP. 2035, to its westernmost corner; thence along a right line to the casti

BULLER

All that area bounded by a line commencing at a point on the sea coast in the middle of the mouth of the Punakaiki River, and proceeding generally north-easterly and south-easterly along the sea coast, crossing the mouths of all harbours and inlets, to a point due west of the northernmost point of Rabbit Island; thence generally southerly, easterly, and northerly along the boundaries of the Electoral District of Nelson hereinbefore described to the north-west
