7. That the property at No. 237 Brougham Street owned by the applicant be used by the company to provide off-street parking facilities for the company's employees and landscaped to the satisfaction of the Council if at any time so required by the Council.

8. That no subsequent extensions be permitted unless the zoning of the properties concerned is changed to allow such extensions.
