A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to the Wildlife Act 1953, I, Brigadier Sir Bernard Edward Fergusson, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby revoke the Proclamation dated the 10th day of December 1956, and published in *Gazette*, 10 January 1957, No. 1, page 10, proclaiming and declaring land in the Gisborne-East Coast Acclimatisation District (now Rotorua Acclimatisation District) to be a wildlife refuge for the purpose of the said Wildlife Act 1953 in so far as it affects the land described in the Schedule hereto.

PURSUANT to section 14 of the Wildlife Act 1953, I, Brigadier Sir Bernard Edward Fergusson, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby revoke the Proclamation dated the 5th day of November 1963 and published in the *Gazette*, 14 November 1963, No. 74, at page 1835, notifying and declaring an area of land to be a wildlife refuge, and hereby proclaim and declare that area of land described in the Schedule hereto to be a wildlife refuge for the purposes of the said Wildlife Act.
