A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to subsection (6) of section 5 of the Education Lands Act 1949, I, Brigadier Sir Bernard Edward Fergusson, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby proclaim and declare that the land described in the First Schedule hereto, being an area vested in the Auckland Education Board, and the land described in the Second Schedule hereto, being an area vested in the Wellington Education Board, as sites for public schools, shall be vested in Her Majesty the Queen, freed and discharged from every educational trust affecting the same, but subject to all leases, encumbrances, liens, or easements affecting the same at the date hereof.

FIRST SCHEDULE

NORTH AUCKLAND LAND DISTRICT

PART Allotment 209, Mareretu Parish, situated in Block VIII, Matakoho Survey District: Area, 5 acres 1 rood 29 perches, more or less. All certificate of title, Volume 410, folio 297. Revoking Part of a Proclamation Declaring Land in the Gisborne - East Coast Acclimatisation District as a Wildlife Refuge

A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to the Wildlife Act 1953, I, Brigadier Sir Bernard Edward Fergusson, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby revoke the Proclamation dated the 10th day of December 1956, and published in *Gazette*, 10 January 1957, No. 1, page 10, proclaiming and declaring land in the Gisborne - East Coast Acclimatisation District (now Rotorua Acclimatisation District) to be a wildlife refuge for the purpose of the said Wildlife Act 1953 in so far as it affects the land described in the Schedule hereto, and I hereby further declare that the restrictions as to the use of boats in the said Proclamation are hereby revoked.

SCHEDULE

ALL that area comprising Punga 3B 1, Parts Punga 3A 2 and 3B 2, Parts Maraetaha No. 2c and Section 3, No. 2 Blocks, Lot 1, D.P. 3892, and Section 3r, Block VII, Nuhaka North Survey District, containing 516 acres and 23.8 perches, being Gisborne City Waterworks Reserve.
