Proroguing the General Assembly

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS on the 30th day of October 1963 the General Assembly of New Zealand was summoned to a meeting on the 23rd day of January 1964: And whereas for certain causes and consideration I have thought fit to prorogue it:

Now, therefore, pursuant to the New Zealand Constitution Act 1852, I, Brigadier Sir Bernard Edward Fergusson, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby prorogue the General Assembly until Thursday, the 9th day of April 1964, and summon it to meet at 2.30 p.m. on that day in the Parliament House in the City of Wellington.

Given under the hand of His Excellency the Governor-General, and issued under the Seal of New Zealand, this 21st day of January 1964.
