1. (1) This order may be cited as the Mana College Board of Governors Order 1964.
(2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of June 1964.

2. The constitution of the Board of Governors of Mana College, prescribed by the Mana College Board of Governors Order 1959,\* is hereby varied so that, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in section 90 of the Education Act 1914, the school shall be controlled by a Board of Governors constituted as follows:

(a) One member appointed by the Wellington Education

(b) Five members elected by the parents of the pupils

attending the school;

(c) One member appointed by the Hutt County Council;

(d) One member appointed by the Porirua Borough Council;

(e) Two members elected by the school committees of the Cannons Creek, Ngatitoa, Paremalta, Pauatahanui, Plimmerton, Porirua, Porirua East, Pukerua Bay, Titahi Bay, Titahi Bay North, and Windley public schools

3. The Minister of Education may from time to time, by notice in the *Gazette*, amend the list of schools to which paragraph (e) of clause 2 of this order applies.

4. The Mana College Board of Governors Order 1959\* is
