THE RIGHT HON. KEITH HOLYOAKE, C.H., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL
PURSUANT to the Cemeteries Act 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Dunsandel Cemetery Order 1964.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1964.

2. The Ellesmere County Council is hereby appointed to be the trustee of the Dunsandel Cemetery, being the area described in the Schedule hereto, and shall have the control and management of that cemetery under and for the purposes of the Cemeteries Act 1908.

3. (1) The delegation to the Selwyn County Council of the powers of appointing and removing trustees of the said cemetery, made by Order in Council dated the 18th day of September 1933,* is hereby revoked.

(2) The said Order in Council is hereby accordingly amended by omitting from the Schedule the words "Selwyn County Council ... Dunsandel".

PURSUANT to the Cemeteries Act 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Tokomaru Bay Cemetery Order 1964.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1964.

2. The Waiapu County Council is hereby appointed to be the trustee of the Tokomaru Bay Cemetery, being the area described in the Schedule hereto, and shall have the control and management of that cemetery under and for the purposes of the Cemeteries Act 1908.
