PURSUANT to section 90 of the Education Act 1914, as amended by section 10 of the Education Amendment Act 1952, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

O R D E R

1. This order may be cited as the Papatoetoe Secondary Schools Board of Governors Order 1964.

2. The constitution of the Board of Governors to which the Papatoetoe High School Board of Governors Order 1964 applied before the commencement of this order is hereby varied so that the Board shall be known as the Papatoetoe Secondary Schools' Board and be constituted as follows:

- (a) One member appointed by the Auckland Education Board;
- (b) Four members elected by the parents of the pupils attending Papatoetoe High School;
- (c) Four members elected by the parents of the pupils attending Aorere College;
- (d) One member appointed by the Papatoetoe Borough Council;
- (e) One member appointed by the Manukau County Council;
- (f) One member co-opted by the Board itself, if and when it thinks fit.

3. The Papatoetoe High School Board of Governors Order 1964\* is hereby revoked.
