HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL PURSUANT to the Public Works Act 1928 and the Electric Power Boards Act 1925, His Excellency the Governor-General acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. This order may be cited as the Wairarapa Electric Power Board Water Power and Electric Lines Licence 1964.

2. Subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth, the Wairarapa Electric Power Board (hereinafter referred to as the licensee) is hereby granted a licence to obstruct, impound, or divert the waters of the Kourarau Stream, to raise or lower the level thereof, and to take and use therefrom, for the purpose hereinafter set forth, a stream of water not exceeding 50 cu. ft. per second and also to lay, construct, put up, place, and use electric lines and to construct electric works within the area described in the First Schedule hereto.

3. The conditions directed to be implied in all licences by the Water Power Regulations 1934 and the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935 shall be incorporated herein and shall form part of this licence, except in so far as they may be inconsistent with the provisions of this licence.

4. This licence is issued under the Water Power Regulations 1934 and is subject thereto and to the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935, the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1961, the Radio Interference Regulations 1958, and to all regulations made in amendment thereof or in substitution therefor, except in so far as they may be inconsistent with the provisions of this licence.

5. The water shall be taken from the Kourarau Stream.

5. The water shall be taken from the Kourarau Stream at a point in Section 2, Block 13, Otahoua Survey District, and at a point in Section 87, Block 13, Otahoua Survey District, as indicated on the plan marked N.Z.E.D. 612 deposited in the office of the New Zealand Electricity Department at Wellington. The water shall be used solely for the purpose of generating electricity.

6. The licensee is hereby authorised, subject to the conditions hereof, to construct, maintain, and use the works described in the Second Schedule hereto, the position of the said works being indicated on the said plan N.Z.E.D. 612.

7. The systems of supply shall be as described in paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), and (h) of regulation 21-01 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1935.

8. Nothing in this licence shall of itself be deemed to confer upon the licensee any right to water.

9. This licence shall, unless sooner lawfully determined, confinue in force until the 31st day of March 1985.

10. The Orders in Council specified in the Third Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.
