FIRST SCHEDULE

CONDITIONS

- 1. The vesting of the said wharf is subject to the Foreshore Licence Regulations 1960, and the provisions of those regulations shall apply hereto except that all dues and rates received on account of the said wharf shall be applied in keeping such wharf and the adjoining shed and the highway leading thereto from the Haast Township in good order, repair, and condition including the removal or extension thereof.
- 2. The term of the vesting shall be 14 years from the 1st day of January 1964.
- 3. The annual sum payable by the Council to the Minister shall be one shilling (1s.) payable on demand.
- 4. The master of every vessel discharging ballast at the said wharf shall have all such ballast taken away and deposited above high-water mark or at such place as may be approved by the Council for that purpose.
- 5. Before any vessel is removed from the said wharf the master shall cause all dirt, rubbish, sullage, or refuse remaining after or caused by the loading or unloading of such vessel to be cleared from that portion of the wharf opposite to the berth occupied by the vessel; and such dirt, rubbish, or refuse shall be deposited at such places as may be approved by the Causeil for by the Council or by any person appointed by the Council for that purpose.
- 6. All persons using the said wharf for the purpose of loading timber or goods shall remove any straw, dunnage, rubbish, or refuse of any kind whatsoever.
- 7. The master of every vessel and all persons entitled to use the said wharf or to anchor in the vicinity of the wharf shall not commit a nuisance on, under, or about the wharf or deposit refuse in the sea surrounding or adjacent to the

SECOND SCHEDULE

Interpretation and Dues
