County and Borough of Ashburton, containing 758,500 acres,
more or less, bounded by a line commencing at a point on the
sea coast in the middle of the mouth of the Rakaia River
and proceeding north-westerly up the middle of the main
stream of that river to a point in line with the southeastern boundary of Rural Section 36983, Block VI, Hutt
Survey District; thence south-westerly to and along that
boundary and its production to the middle of Double Hill
Road; thence north-westerly along the middle of that road
to a point in line with the southern boundary of Rural

2. The concessions and privileges conferred by this Order
