National Roads Board—Notice Prohibiting the Parking of Vehicles on Portion of No. 48 State Highway and Declaring Portion of the Highway to be One-way Road

Pursuant to National Roads Board Bylaw 1958 No. 1†, the Board has, by resolution carried at its meeting of 23 June 1965, prohibited the stopping or parking of vehicles on the up route of the loop road section of No. 48 State Highway (Chateau) (route mileage 7.9 to 8.5 approximately) and has prohibited the parking of vehicles on the right-hand side of the down route on the aforesaid section.
