PURSUANT to the Forest and Rural Fires Act 1955, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby constitute and declare the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a rural fire district, to be known as the "Aupouri Rural Fire District"; and does hereby specify the gumlands, peat lands, and sand-dune areas in the said area as the property for the protection of which the district is constituted; and does hereby specify the period between the 1st day of October in any one year and the 30th day of April in the following year (both days inclusive) as a closed fire season in the said district; and does hereby declare that this Order in Council shall come into force and that the Aupouri Rural Fire District shall become a rural fire district on the day following publication of this Order in Council in the Gazette; and does hereby prescribe that the said Aupouri Rural Fire and does hereby prescribe that the said Aupouri Rural Fire District shall be administered for the purposes of the said Act by the Minister of Forests.
