6. Nothing herein contained shall authorise the board to remove or cause to be removed any stones, sand, shingle, or shells without the consent of the Minister being first obtained.

7. Subject to the provisions of section 8A of the Act, the board for and within the area of the waters described in the First Schedule hereto—

 (b) May appoint harbourmasters and or officers and define or limit their powers or duties;

8. Bylaws made by the board under the authority of this Order in Council shall not come into force until they have been approved by the Minister, by notice in the Gazette.
9. No authority conferred by this Order in Council shall be exercised by the council in respect of waters or lake bed now or hereafter used for hydro-electric installations, except with the approval of the New Zealand Electricity Department.
10. The rights, powers, privileges, control, functions, duties, and authorities conferred by or under this Order in Council shall continue to be in force for 21 years from the day following the date of its notification in the Gazette, unless in the meantime such rights, powers, privileges, control, functions, duties, and authorities shall be altered, modified, or revoked by competent authority.
11. The said rights, powers, privileges, control, functions, duties, and authorities may be at any time resumed by the Governor-General, without payment of any compensation whatever, on giving to the board six calendar months' notice in writing. Any such notice shall be sufficient if given by the Minister and delivered at or posted to the last known address of the council in New Zealand.
