A PROCLAMATION

TO THE MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENT elected to serve in the House of Representatives:

GREETING.

WHEREAS the General Assembly of New Zealand stands prorogued to the 28th day of April 1966: And whereas for certain causes and considerations I have thought fit to prorogue it further:

You are now hereby summoned to appear on Thursday, the 26th day of May 1966, for the Dispatch of Business, at 2.30 p.m., in the Parliament House in the City of Wellington, there to take into consideration the state and welfare of New Zealand and therein to do as may seem necessary.
