IN pursuance of the powers conferred on it by the Noxious Weeds Act 1950, the Te Kuiti Borough Council hereby resolves, by way of Special Order, that the plants named in the Schedule hereunder (being plants mentioned in the First Schedule of the Noxious Weeds Act 1950) be declared noxious weeds within the Borough of Te Kuiti.

SCHEDULE

Barbery (*Berberis vulgaris*)
Barley grass (*Hordeum murinum*)
Bathurst bur (*Xanthium spinosum*)
Fennel (*Foeniculum vulgare*)
Hemlock (*Conium maculatum*)
Nodding thistle (*Carduus nutans*).

Reserve Bank of New Zealand

PURSUANT to section 33 of the Reserve Bank of New Zealand Act 1964, the Reserve Bank, acting with the approval of the Minister of Finance, hereby gives notice that as at the close of business on Thursday, 20 October 1966, and until further notice, balances to be maintained in the Reserve Bank by each trading bank shall be equal to an amount which, when added to that bank's holdings of Reserve Bank notes as disclosed in that bank's latest available weekly return of Banking Statistics under the Statistics Act 1955, will be not less than the aggregate of: 16 per cent of that bank's demand deposits in New Zealand plus 3 per cent of that bank's time deposits in New Zealand (excluding wool retention deposits) as shown in the last preceding monthly return furnished by that bank in accordance with section 31 of the Reserve Bank of New Zealand Act 1964.

The balances to be maintained as aforesaid shall be exclusive of any balance held by a trading bank in its wool retention or special fund account at the Reserve Bank.
