A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to the New Zealand Constitution Act 1852, I, Brigadier Sir Bernard Edward Fergusson, the Governor-General of New Zealand, being desirous that the General Assembly of New Zealand should be held as soon as may be, hereby summon the said General Assembly to meet in the Parliament House, in the City of Wellington, on Thursday, the 26th day of January 1967, at 2.30 p.m.
