TARIFF AND DEVELOPMENT BOARD NOTICE NO. 56

PUBLIC INQUIRY INTO IMPORT DUTIES AND IMPORT LICENSING AFFECTING TOPDRESSING AIRCRAFT

- The Tariff and Development Board proposes to inquire into and report on the question of whether the present rates of duty payable on topdressing aircraft (and parts thereof) for use in aerial topdressing and other agricultural work should be increased and, if so, what rates of duty should be imposed on such aircraft. The inquiry will also include import licensing as affecting such goods.
- The goods in question are covered by the following Tariff provisions:

Import Control Exemption Notice (No. 2) 1967

PURSUANT to regulation 16 of the Import Control Regulations 1964*, the Minister of Customs hereby gives notice as follows:

- (a) This notice may be cited as the Import Control Exemption Notice (No. 2) 1967.
(b) This notice shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.
- Goods of the class specified in the First Schedule hereto, imported from and being the manufacture of any country, are hereby exempted from the requirements of a licence under the said regulations.
- The exemption from the requirements of a licence under the said regulations in respect of the goods of the classes set forth in the Second Schedule hereto included in the exempting notice shown in the Second Schedule is hereby withdrawn.
