RESOLUTION

"In pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by section 108a of the Municipal Corporations Act 1954, as enacted by section 10 of the Municipal Corporations Amendment Act 1959, and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Pukekohe Borough Council hereby resolves by way of special order that, instead of levying the special rates specified in the Schedule hereto, a uniform consolidated special rate of one decimal nought one nine cents (1.019c) in the dollar (\$) on all rateable property within the Borough of Pukekohe be, and the same is hereby made an annually recurring rate for the purpose of paying the annual charges plus 10 percent thereof payable in respect of the loans secured by those special rates; and the Pukekohe Borough Council hereby further resolves that the consolidated special rate shall be payable in one sum on the 1st day of July in each year at the Municipal Chambers, Wesley Street, Pukekohe, to Noel Edward Ashby, Town Clerk and Treasurer, or at such other place or to such other person for the time being authorised by the Council. by the Council.
