Pursuant to the Control of Prices Act 1947, the Price Tribunal hereby makes the following price order:

PRELIMINARY

1. This order may be cited as Price Order No. 2061 and shall come into force on the 2nd day of October 1967.

2. (1) Price Order No. 2046* shall be revoked on the coming into force of this order.
(2) The revocation of the said order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this order.

3. In this order unless the context otherwise requires "existing currency" and "decimal currency" shall have the same meaning as in the Decimal Currency Act 1964.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

4. This order applies in respect of all sales of bread referred to in clauses 4, 5, and 6 of Price Order 2043 (Bread) sold in New Zealand for which special approval has been granted to any baker, wholesaler, or retailer, to make an addition to the maximum prices fixed from time to time by price order in respect of extraordinary charges (freight or otherwise) incurred by the baker, wholesaler, or retailer.

CONVERSION OF APPROVED ADDITIONS TO MAXIMUM PRICES FROM THE EXISTING CURRENCY TO DECIMAL CURRENCY

5. Where additions to the maximum retail prices fixed by price order have been approved in the existing currency, such additions are to be converted to decimal currency in accordance with the following table:
