ORDER

1. This order shall take effect on 1 November 1967.

2. The areas described in the First Schedule hereto are hereby excluded from the County of Wairarapa South and included in the County of Masterton.

3. The areas described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby excluded from the County of Masterton and included in the County of Wairarapa South.

4. The alteration of the boundaries of the said Counties hereinbefore made shall be deemed to have been effected under the Counties Act 1956.

FIRST SCHEDULE

FIRSTLY, all that area in the Wellington Land District containing 79 acres, more or less, bounded by a line rommencing at the westernmost corner of Section 1, Block XIV, Otahoua S.D., and proceeding north-easterly along the north-western boundary of that section to the north-eastern boundary of Section 54, Tupurupuru District; thence south-easterly along the north-eastern boundaries of Sections 54 and 62, Tupurupuru District, to the southern boundary of Section 1 aforesaid; thence generally westerly along that boundary to the point of commencement.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Commissions of Inquiry Act 1908, by Order in Council dated the 13th day of February 1967*, you were appointed to be a commission to inquire into and report upon the cause of the disaster which occurred at the Strongman Mine, on the 19th day of January 1967, and matters incidental thereto:
