Open Season for Game in Acclimatisation Districts-North Island

IMPORTANT-The closed game areas published in the supplement, dated 26 March 1965 to the *Gazette* of 25 March 1965, and in any subsequent *Gazette* notice, apply to the 1968 open season for game, subject to any amendments thereto and deletions therefrom published in this notice.
