Revoking a Proclamation Declaring an Area in the Rotorua Acclimatisation District to be a Wildlife Refuge

A PROCLAMATION

PURSUANT to section 14 of the Wildlife Act 1953, I, Sir Arthur Espie Porritt, Baronet, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby revoke the Proclamation issued on the 28th day of March 1958* declaring an area of land in the Hawke's Bay Land District, Wairoa County, in the Rotorua Acclimatisation District, to be a wildlife refuge for the purposes of the Wildlife Act 1953, as shown on plan marked I.A. 52/283 deposited in the Head Office, Department of Internal Affairs, Wellington, and thereon edged red.
