to take and use therefrom for the purpose hereinafter set forth, a stream of water not exceeding 400 cubic feet per second at any one time, and also to lay, construct, put up, place, and use electric lines and to construct electric works as described in the First Schedule hereto and also in the area therein described. therein described.

- 3. The conditions directed to be implied in all licences by the Water Power Regulations 1934 and the Electrical Supply Regulations 1967 shall be incorporated herein and shall form part of this licence, except in so far as they may be inconsistent with the provisions of this licence.
- 4. This licence is subject to the Water Power Regulations 1934, the Electrical Supply Regulations 1967, the Electrical Wiring Regulations 1961, and the Radio Interference Regulations 1958, and to all regulations made in amendment thereof, or in substitution therefor, except in so far as they may be inconsistent with the provisions of this licence.
- 5. Water shall be used under this licence solely for the purpose of generating electricity and shall be taken from the said stream at a point approximately 3½ miles downstream from the Taumarunui-Turangi State Highway bridge over the said stream, the said point being more particularly indicated on the plan marked S.H.D. 352 deposited in the office of the New Zealand Electricity Department at Wellington.
- 6. The licensee is hereby authorised, subject to the conditions hereof, to construct, maintain and use the works described in the Second Schedule hereto, the position of the said works being indicated on the said plan S.H.D. 352.
- 7. The systems of supply shall be as described in paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), and (j) of regulation 15 of the Electrical Supply Regulations 1967. The system of supply authorised under paragraph (j) shall be a single conductor earth-return system and the use thereof shall be subject to the terms and conditions laid down by the General Manager of the New Zealand Electricity Department.
- 8. Nothing in this licence shall of itself be deemed to confer upon the licensee any right to water.
- 9. This licence shall, unless it is sooner lawfully determined, continue in force until the 31st day of March 1989.
- 10. The lines described in paragraph 3 of the First Schedule hereto shall not be used by the licensee for the purpose of supply to retail consumers in the Borough of Taumarunui.
- 11. The Orders in Council referred to in the Third Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

(c) A line leading from a point on the north bank of the Ongarue River and proceeding in a northerly direction to the south bank of the Ongarue River, as the said electric line is shown by means of a red line on plan marked N.Z.E.D. 750 deposited as aforesaid.
