NOBEL PEACE PRIZE

ALL proposals of candidates for the Nobel Peace Prize, which is to be distributed 10 December 1969, must, in order to be taken into consideration, be laid before the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament by a duly qualified person before the 1st day of February 1969.

Any one of the following persons is held to be duly qualified:

- (a) Members and late members of the Nobel Committee of the Norwegian Parliament, as well as the advisers appointed at the Norwegian Nobel Institute;
- (b) Members of parliament and members of government of the different States, as well as members of the Inter-parliamentary Union;
- (c) Members of the International Arbitration Court at the Hague;
- (d) Members and associates of the Institute of International Law;
- (e) Members of the executive committee of the International Peace Bureau;
- (f) University professors of political science and of law, of history and of philosophy; and
- (g) Persons who have received the Nobel Peace Prize.

The Nobel Peace Prize may also be accorded to institutions or associations.
