RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE

Rural Housing Loan 1967—\$20,000

"THAT for the purpose of providing the annual charges on a loan of \$20,000, authorised to be raised by the Vincent County Council under the Rural Housing Act 1939 for the purpose of making advances to farmers in terms of the said Act, the said Vincent County Council hereby resolves to make a special rate of 0.01584 of a cent in the dollar (\$) upon the rateable unimproved value of all rateable property of the special rating area comprising the whole of the County of Vincent; and that the special rate shall be an annually recurring rate during the currency of the loan and be payable yearly on the 30th day of September in each and every year during the currency of the loan, being a period of 25 years, or until the loan is fully paid off."

RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE

Bridge Renewal Loan 1967—\$20,000

"THAT for the purpose of providing the annual charges on a loan of \$20,000, authorised to be raised by the Vincent County Council under the Local Authorities Loans Act 1956 for the purpose of refunding the County Fund Account in respect of the Council's share of the cost of the Bannockburn, Fraser River, and Wainui Creek bridges, the said Vincent County Council hereby makes a special rate of 0.0162 of a cent in the dollar (\$) upon the rateable unimproved value of all rateable property of the special rating area comprising the whole of the county of Vincent; and that the said special rate shall be an annually recurring rate during the currency of the loan and be payable yearly on the 30th day of September in each and every year during the currency of the loan, being a period of 30 years or until the loan is fully paid off."

APPLICATION FOR A LICENCE FOR A WATER RACE
