1. The present division of the County of Taupo into seven ridings be revoked and in lieu thereof the said county shall be divided into eight ridings, to be called respectively Mangakino Riding, Pouakani Riding, Tatua Riding, Tauhara Riding, Kaingaroa Riding, Rangitoto Riding, Tongariro Riding, and Turangi Riding, which said ridings are respectively described in the Schedule hereto.

2. That, pursuant to section 36 of the Counties Act 1956, the Taupo County Council shall consist of 11 members who shall be elected as follows:
