

OTAGO CATCHMENT BOARD

RESOLUTION MAKING AND LEVYING SPECIAL RATE

Office Building Loan 1968—\$50,000

PURSUANT to the Local Authorities' Loans Act 1956, the Otago Catchment Board hereby resolves as follows:

That, for the purpose of providing the annual charges on a loan of \$50,000 authorised to be raised by the Otago Catchment Board under the above-mentioned Act for the purpose of meeting part of the cost of erecting a new office building, the said Otago Catchment Board hereby makes a special rate of decimal nought nought one six cents (.0016c) in the dollar (\$) upon the rateable capital value of all rateable property of the Otago Catchment District; and that the special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of the loan and shall be payable yearly on the 1st day of September in each and every year during the currency of the loan, being a period of 10 years or until the loan is fully paid off.

The foregoing resolution was passed at a special meeting of the Otago Catchment Board held on the 18th day of October 1968.
