Price Order No. 2093 (Cornsacks)

PURSUANT to the Control of Prices Act 1947, I, Clifford Ernest Beard, pursuant to a delegation from the Secretary of Industries and Commerce acting under a delegation from the Price Tribunal, hereby make the following price order:

- 1. This order may be cited as Price Order No. 2093 and shall come into force on the 15th day of November 1968.
- 2. (1) Price Order No. 2063* is hereby revoked.
- (2) The revocation of the said order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this order.

APPLICATION OF THIS ORDER

3. This order applies with respect to sales by way of retail of all cornsacks other than secondhand cornsacks sold in New Zealand.

Fixing Maximum Retail Prices of Cornsacks to Which This Order Applies

- 4. (1) The maximum retail price that may be charged or received for any cornsacks to which this order applies shall be determined as follows:
- (a) When sold "ex wharf" at Auckland, Napier, Wellington, Lyttelton, Timaru, Dunedin, or Bluff: For 46-in. by 23-in. cornsacks, \$\frac{54.28}{24.28} \text{ as } \frac{1}{28.72} \text{ per dozen}; for 48-in. by 26\frac{1}{2}\text{in. cornsacks}, \$4.38 per dozen.
- (b) When sold "ex store" at Auckland, Napier, Wellington, Lyttelton, Timaru, Dunedin, or Bluff: For 46-in. by 23-in. cornsacks, \$3.82 per dozen; for 48-in. by 26½-in. cornsacks, \$4.48 per dozen.
