PURSUANT to the Burial and Cremation Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. This order may be cited as the Tataraimaka Cemetery Closing Order 1968.

2. It is hereby directed that the Tataraimaka Cemetery, being the area described in the Schedule hereto, shall be closed and burials therein discontinued after the 30th day of September 1968.

3. As from the 30th day of September 1968 the control and management of the closed Tataraimaka Cemetery shall vest in the Taranaki County Council.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the 7th day of September 1932, and published in *Gazette*, 8 September 1932, Vol. III, page 1974, an area of Crown land was vested, subject to the conditions set forth in the said Order in Council, in the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Dunedin for tree-planting purposes, pursuant to section 20 of the Land Laws Amendment Act 1926.
