Import Control Exemption Notice (No. 11) 1968

PURSUANT to regulation 16 of the Import Control Regulations 1964*, the Minister of Customs hereby gives notice as follows:

1. (a) This notice may be cited as the Import Control Exemption Notice (No. 11) 1968.
- (b) This notice shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.
2. Goods of the classes specified and for the purposes of the Customs Tariff falling within the Tariff items in the First Schedule hereto, and goods of the classes specified in the Second Schedule hereto, imported from and being the produce or manufacture of any country, are hereby exempted from the requirement of a licence under the said regulations.

FIRST SCHEDULE

EXEMPTIONS CREATED

Tariff Item	Classes of Goods
Ex 84.32.00	Book-binding machinery, including book-sewing machines (other than machines for glueing strips of paper or textiles on to loose leaves, and gang or gather stitch machines).
Ex 84.33.00	Paper or paperboard cutting machines; other machinery for making up paper pulp, paper, or paperboard (other than hand shear guillotines and collating machines).
Ex 84.56.09	Machinery for agglomerating, moulding, or shaping solid mineral fuels, ceramic paste, unhardened cements, plastering materials, or other mineral products in powder or paste form (excluding concrete block-making machines).
84.57.00	Glass-working machines (other than machines for working glass in the cold); machines for assembling electric filament and discharge lamps and electronic and similar tubes and valves.
84.34.01	Type-casting machines and accessories (including matrices) peculiar thereto.
Ex 84.34.09	Other type-founding and type-setting machinery (excluding stereo-moulding machines and stereo-grinding machines and lithographic printing plates).
Ex 84.35.01	Printing machinery (excluding printing rollers made of metal and covered or faced with rubber or polyurethane, when imported as parts of printing machines, heat embossing machines and silk-screen printing machines).
Ex 84.35.09	Machines for uses ancillary to printing (excluding paper drills up to 1 in. diameter and paper jogging boards).
84.37.03	Embroidery machines which, by means of needles, embroider designs with one or more threads on an existing ground of woven fabric or other material.
84.40.31	Machinery for cleaning, dressing, finishing, or coating textile yarns, fabrics, or made-up textile articles (other than drycleaning, washing, and laundry machines, bleaching and dyeing machinery, and drying machines); fabric folding, reeling, or cutting machines (other than shirt folding tables); machines of a kind used in the manufacture of linoleum or other floor coverings for applying the paste to the base fabric or other support; machines of a type used for printing a repetitive design, repetitive words, or overall colour on textiles, leather, wallpaper, wrapping paper, linoleum, or other materials.
Ex 84.45.14	Automatic single and multi-spindle bar lathes; automatic chucking lathes.
Ex 84.45.15	Multi-spindle drills, radial drilling machines not less than 1 in. capacity.
Ex 84.45.16	Duplicating, profiling, and pantograph milling machines.
Ex 84.45.17	Internal or external cylindrical grinding machines; centreless grinders.
84.46.00	Machine tools for working stone, ceramics, concrete, asbestos-cement and like mineral materials, or for working glass in the cold, other than machines falling within heading No. 84.49.
85.12.02	Electric soil-heating apparatus.
