*Notice to Make Returns of Land Under the Land and Income Tax Act 1954*

PURSUANT to the Land and Income Tax Act 1954, the Commissioner of Inland Revenue hereby gives notice as follows:

1. A return of land held as at noon on 31 March 1969 is required from every person and company, whether a taxpayer or not, being the owner of land in New Zealand within the meaning of the Land and Income Tax Act 1954, if the total unimproved value exceeds \$60,000.

2. Returns are required to be delivered or forwarded to the district office of the Inland Revenue Department where the taxpayer's records are filed not later than 7 May 1969.

3. Return forms are available at all district offices of the Inland Revenue Department.

4. Any person or company failing to furnish a return within the prescribed time is liable to a fine not exceeding \$200 or not less than \$4.

*Reserve Bank of New Zealand*
