That, for the purpose of providing the annual charges on a loan of \$100,000 authorised to be raised by the Dunedin City Council under the above-mentioned Act for the purpose of purchasing properties to provide sites for off-street parking, the said Dunedin City Council hereby makes a special rate of 0.0128c in the dollar (\$) upon the rateable value of all rateable property of the City of Dunedin, comprising the whole of the City of Dunedin; and that the special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of the loan, and be payable yearly, on the 1st day of June in each and every year during the currency of the loan, being a period of thirty (30) years, or until the loan is fully paid off.
