

The date proposed for the hearing of the application by the Court is the 30th day of April 1969, and the hearing will take place at the Supreme Court at Wellington at 10 a.m.

Any person desiring to oppose the scheme must give written notice of his intention to do so to the Registrar, Supreme Court, Masterton; to the trustees of the Martinborough Combined Interhouse Team's Queen Carnival Fund, care of Messrs Gawith, Neild, and Laing, Solicitors, Jellicoe Street, Martinborough; and to the Attorney-General, Crown Law Office, Wellington, not less than 7 clear days before the above-mentioned date of hearing.

PARTICULARS OF SCHEME

THAT the funds held by the trustees of the Martinborough Combined Interhouse Team's Queen Carnival Fund be applied so that

- (a) all reasonable expenses of and incidental to preparing perusing and advertising this scheme, including the costs of the Attorney-General, be paid out of the fund;
- (b) the balance of the fund be distributed equally among the following organisations for the purposes stated:
