The Motor Launch (Lake Wakatipu) Notice 1969

PURSUANT to the Motor Launch Regulations 1962, the Minister of Marine hereby gives the following notice.

## NOTICE

1. (1) This notice may be cited as the Motor Launch (Lake Wakatipu) Notice 1969.

(2) This notice shall come into force on the date of its publication in the Gazette, and shall expire at the end of 5 vears after that date.

2. Regulations 11 and 12 of the Motor Launch Regulations 1962\* shall not apply with respect to powered vessels and water skiers operating in the area described in the First Schedule hereto, subject to compliance with the conditions specified in the Second Schedule hereto, and so long as the notices specified in clauses 2 and 3 of that Schedule are erected in accordance with those clauses.

### FIRST SCHEDULE

ALL that area of water of Lake Wakatipu, at Kingston, within 200 yd of the edge of the water and bounded on the sides by parallel lines 500 yd apart, the western boundary line being extended in a  $30^{\circ}$  direction from a point on the shore line about 75 yd east of the New Zealand Railways wharf embankment marked by a large willow tree.

### SECOND SCHEDULE

1. No person shall propel or navigate a powered vessel at a proper speed greater than 5 miles per hour when-

(a) within 100 ft of any other vessel; or

(b) within 100 ft of any person in the water, or bathing, or fishing

2. The area of water described in the First Schedule hereto shall be shown cross hatched on a plan of the lake on a scale not less than 5 chains to 1 in., which shall be displayed on the lower portion of a notice board measuring not less than 2 ft 6 in. by 2 ft, painted bright orange with black lettering, which notice board shall be erected at each place where boats are normally launched.

3. The upper and middle portion of the aforesaid notice board shall contain the following notice—

# MOTOR LAUNCH REGULATIONS 1962

There is no speed restriction for motor launches and water skiers using the area shown cross hatched on the

plan below, subject to the following conditions:

No person shall propel or navigate a powered vessel at a proper speed greater than 5 miles per hour when— (a) within 100 ft of any other vessel; or (b) within 100 ft of any person in the water or bathing or fishing."
