

BOROUGH OF MOSGIEL

RESOLUTION MAKING SPECIAL RATE

PURSUANT to the Local Authorities Loans Act 1956, the Mosgiel Borough Council hereby resolves as follows:

"That, for the purpose of providing the annual charges on a loan of \$93,000 authorised to be raised by the Mosgiel Borough Council under the above-mentioned Act for the purpose of completing the construction of the sports pavilion on Memorial Park, the said Mosgiel Borough Council hereby makes a special rate of decimal two five cents (.25c) in the dollar (\$) upon the rateable value of all rateable property (on the basis of the unimproved value) of the Borough of Mosgiel, comprising the whole of the Borough of Mosgiel; and that the special rate shall be an annual-recurring rate during the currency of the loan and be payable yearly on the 1st day of April in each and every year during the currency of the loan, being a period of twenty-five (25) years, or until the loan is fully paid off."

The above resolution was duly passed at a meeting of the Mosgiel Borough Council held on the 3rd day of June 1969.
