## Approval of Revolving Amber Lights for Certain Vehicles

## Consenting to Raising of Loans by Certain Local Authorities

PURSUANT to regulation 39 of the Traffic Regulations 1956\*, the Secretary for Transport hereby approves the fitting of one revolving yellow or amber light on any motor vehicle owned or operated by the New Zealand Post Office, subject to the following conditions:

1. The vehicle shall be painted a conspicuous colour.
2. The light shall not be used while the vehicle is moving.
3. The light shall be used only at the site of a traffic hazard, such as broken telephone lines.
4. Suitable and adequate warning signs shall be provided as soon as possible after the occurrence of the hazard.
