### NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR APPROVAL OF SCHEME

Under the will of William Charles Stewart, who died in 1899, land was left to "the Borough of Tauranga" with provision for the income to "be devoted to the relief of destitute persons of the aforesaid Borough".
