A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS the General Assembly of New Zealand stands prorogued to the 12th day of March 1970:

Now, therefore, We hereby issue this Our Royal Proclamation and declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure that the said General Assembly shall be held in the Parliament House in the City of Wellington at 2 p.m. on Thursday, the 12th day of March 1970, there to take into consideration the state and welfare of New Zealand and therein to do as may seem necessary: And the Members of Parliament elected to serve in the House of Representatives are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly on the said Thursday, the 12th day of March 1970.

Given at Our Court at St. James and issued under the Seal of New Zealand, this 5th day of February 1970, in the eighteenth year of Our Reign.
