

Tariff and Development Board Notice No. 223—Public Inquiry into Import Duties and Import Licensing Affecting Bookbinders' Gathering and Stitching Machines (Ex Tariff Item 84.32.00)

1. In its report No. 114 of 23 February 1970 to the Minister of Customs, the Tariff and Development Board recommended that because of the need for more development and testing, involving both the New Zealand manufacturer and the "user industries", the question of duties and import licensing concerning bookbinders' gathering and stitching machines (Ex T.I. 84.32.00) should be reviewed by the Board in June 1971. This recommendation was accepted by Government.

2. The Board will therefore now be reviewing this matter and, in accordance with its normal procedures, will conduct a public hearing in the Boardroom, First Floor, Law Society Building, 26 Waring Taylor Street, Wellington, on Tuesday, 27 July 1971, commencing at 10.30 a.m.

3. Any person who intends to tender evidence should lodge 12 copies of a typewritten statement of the evidence, to be presented under oath at the public inquiry, at the Board's office no later than Tuesday, 13 July 1971. In preparing this evidence the "Notes for Guidance of Witnesses" prepared by the Board may be of assistance. Copies of these notes may be obtained from the Board's office.
